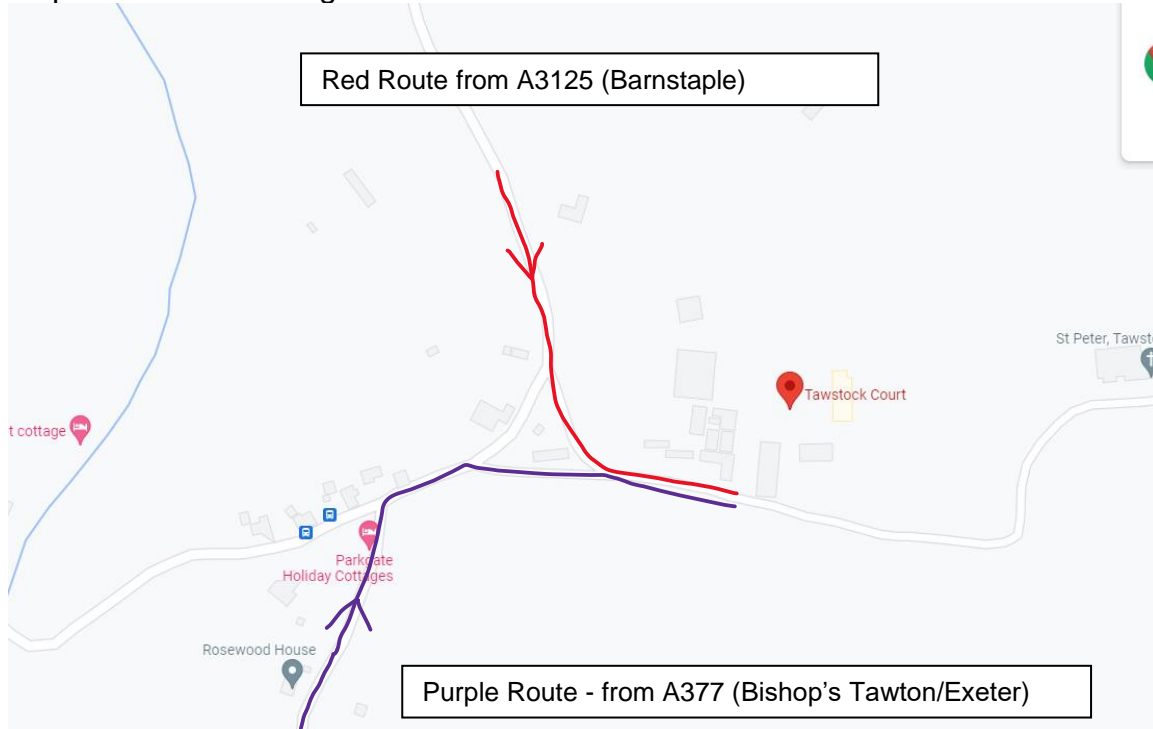


## Directions to Tawstock Court

### Map of Tawstock Village



### Red route

From the train station

Exit the train station car park and carry along Station Road until you reach a roundabout (Halfords will be on your right). Go straight across the roundabout on the A3125 towards the M5.

Continue straight through the next set of traffic lights.

At Sticklepath Junction (roundabout) continue the A1325 towards Instow.

As you drive up the hill take your first left towards Tawstock (immediately after the pedestrian crossing).

Follow this road – looks like a country lane for approximately 2 miles. You will pass Tawstock Castle on your right and through a hamlet called Lake. After around 2 miles you will see a sign saying Tawstock and immediately in front of the sign is a left-hand turn which you need to take, don't worry if you miss it, take the next left by the red telephone box and the road will join up. You will travel past stone pillars on either side of the road, and then see a very tall stone gate entrance on your left with double doors open for you to drive through and park. Please drive round to the higher levels of the car park unless you need to be close to the venue.

### Purple route

If you are travelling from Bishop's Tawton along the A377 you will leave the village, take a sharp right bend, go over a bridge (River Taw) and another bridge for train and as the road take a sharp left you will see a sign directing you to Tawstock and you will need to turn right. Follow this road you will come across another road but follow the sign to Tawstock, stay on this road until you see the village sign on your right, carry on until you get to a T junction and turn right towards Lake & Barnstaple. Take your next right-hand turn very shortly afterwards (you will see a red telephone box by the turning). You will travel past stone pillars on either side of the road, and then see a very tall stone gate entrance on your left with double doors open for you to drive through and park. Please drive round to the higher levels of the car park unless you need to be close to the venue.
