## Local trusts that are worth building a relationship with:

- **THE CHARLOTTE HEBER-PERCY CHARITABLE TRUST** – Grants from under £1,000 to £20,000 for UK registered charities working in the UK and overseas, particularly in the areas of animal welfare, arts and museums, education, the environment and medical, cancer and hospices. Application deadline: none - applications may be made at any time in writing. Please note that the Trust does not maintain a website. Further information is, however, available on the Charity Commission website. Applications, which are reviewed by the Trust every three months, may be made at any time in writing.
- **THE CLARE MILNE TRUST** – Grants generally over £2,500 for smaller registered charities in the South West region (with a preference for Devon and Cornwall) that are working to improve the quality of life for people with a disability. Eligible charities should fulfil the following criteria:
  - Be small and well run.
  - Have modest expenditure on fundraising and administration
  - Have strong support from volunteers.
- There is no set level of grant award, although the Trust rarely awards a grant of under £2,500. - **ELMGRANT TRUST** - The Trust will consider applications from the South West area of England, especially Devon and Cornwall; projects which help to improve the quality of local life and welfare; art projects which help to improve the quality of local life from individuals who are further educating themselves to improve their job prospects with a clear compassionate need. The Trust will receive applications for core running costs or project costs of small established organisations who have a proven record of making a significant

difference.

Average grants are in the region of £450 or £150 for individuals. Applications should be made in writing.

Grants are usually for £1,000 or less, with the occasional award over £1,000.

- **The Jephcott Trust** awards grants under the following priorities:
