Key successes

Strategic and operational alignment with Active Devon

We have now reached completion of our first pilot project that aimed to tackle health inequalities through physical activity (see THIPA page in this report). Community Developers worked hard to recruit new delivery partners, that meet minimum operating standards, to ensure safe, quality activity delivery. Positive movement programmes were set up across every One Community and efforts were taken to reach out and involve a diverse set of participants, reaching over 400 people. Interestingly, the programme ended with a focus on community development, via a workshop with Interwoven CIC, to learn about their 'quiet voice methodology' and associated toolkit to help kickstart ideas about how we can connect future work with the 'hard to reach' and 'disillusioned' members of our communities by enabling a hyper-local, street level (square kilometre - 'Squilometre') approach.

Joining the dot's between positive movement and community development, we can't wait for the next iteration of the Active Devon and One Northern Devon partnership.

Community Lottery Community Development Bid through to final stage

During the fabulous Interwoven workshop (see above) on 30th November, NDVS/TTVS took the call to say they have made it to Stage 2 with the National Lottery after gaining the Lottery's approval for their expression of interest (Phase 1 of 2).

There will now be lots of work to do finalising the full proposal and we will be seeking to meet with interested partners to develop a shared understanding and ascertain the level of involvement in this important final, full application (Phase 2 of 2).

NDVS and TTVS would like to say 'We can't thank you enough for your support to date - it was so lovely to be sat with James when news came through ... and the workshop will help shape our vision' (of how Community development approaches can support empowering the 'hard to reach' and 'silent and disillusioned' to take action). We are absolutely buzzing and proof that hours of hard-work and collaboration does pay off.' Here's to phase 2 and completing the full application.

Key challenges

Community Development Funding

Whilst NDVS/TTVS are through to phase 2 of the National lottery funding (see above), current funding will only extend Community Developer contracts until April 2024. As such, timings are tight. The Community Lottery bid may come to fruition but it also may not be in time for April. That leaves us with the following risks for the Community Developers that rely on funding:

- a) Lottery Funding bid may not be successful
- b) Lottery funding may be successful but not arrive soon enough, leaving a gap in CD employment and a loss of current CD staff

Mitigations are addressed in the risk register at the end of this report.

Evaluating the One Communities

Currently, this report outlines the outputs and outcomes of the Community Developers as reported by the One Communities. However, more information is required to better demonstrate the true value of the Community Developers and One Communities. Without this there is a risk of:

- a) negatively impacting on future funding bids
- b) may be impacting our ability to learn / develop OC's effectively

Working with the University of Exeter, alongside recent workshops with the OND Board and the OND Community group and Community Developers are supporting the development of a theory of change / logic model as a basis to design a more thorough and effective evaluation framework for the One Communities.

Tackling Health Inequalities through Physical Activity (THIPA)

400+ participants

Increased physical activity, life satisfaction, feeling worthwhile and levels of happiness, whilst reducing anxiety.

16 activity programmes

Enabled by Sport England's 'Together Fund', Active Devon and One Northern Devon partnered with the One Communities to deliver a programme of positive and inclusive movement across Northern Devon to support those 'at risk' or experiencing health inequalities.

As part of continual improvement and to support future working, on the 30th November Community Developers, NDVS, One Northern Devon and Active Devon attended a CPD workshop to explore Interwoven's [Quiet voice methodology](#), an asset-based hyperlocal way of working with the 'hard to reach' and 'muted' (disillusioned, time poor, stressed and introverted). We explored principles such as the place-based [SQUILOMETRE](#), reflective and transactional practice. Exploring practical tools such as creating small communities of practice/action (Pods), create relevant, important, celebratory, convenient and iterative invites to involve 'quiet voices' in people-led community action.

Active Devon are a 'community-focused, non-profit organisation with a vision of everyone in Devon active for life'. As a behavioural determinant of health and wellbeing, finding ways to 'help others to move more' is one way we can help to reduce inequalities and work collaboratively with communities to help 'make movement a positive part of people's lives, whatever their background'. Interwoven CIC are homegrown in Exeter, Devon and 'work towards a world where people are better connected to each other and to their place, building communities capability to identify their own strength and power and be the agents of their OWN change.

As One Northern Devon begin proceedings to merge with the Northern local care partnership, it helps to understand the ICS vision, aims and Community Development & Learning programme objectives.

The merger will help embed place-based partnerships within the integrated care system, with a genuine commitment to listen to, and be led by, community priorities. This supports two of the key aims of the One Communities group (see [OC group terms of reference](#)):

- 4.4. To become an integral part of the wider Devon Integrated Care system, via the Northern Local Care Partnership, with the ability to draw in a broader partnership who are involved in services beyond health but vital to its wider determinants
- 4.5. To ensure wider strategies are localised and achievable

The Integrated Care System (ICS) for Devon, '[One Devon](#)', is a Devon-wide partnership that brings together NHS organisations, local authorities and the VCSE assembly to take collective responsibility for planning services, improving health and reducing inequalities across Devon.

ICS Vision - Equal chances for everyone in Devon to lead long, happy and healthy lives (Our Five-year Integrated Care Strategy)

ICS goals:



We have nine programmes of work in the Joint Forward Plan, as set out below:



9. Community Development and Learning

- Place local communities at the heart of decision-making
- Agree collective community goals
- Support the community development workforce
- Integrate community partnerships into Local Care Partnership infrastructure

To allow us to do this, we will need, for example, to:

- Empower Local Care Partnerships and collaboratives to make decisions with populations, based on evidence
- Ensure use of best practice principles and practice when involving people
- Deliver workforce solutions that will attract staff and support the recruitment and retention of talent

Following the passage of the 2022 Health and Care Act, ICSs were formalised as legal entities with statutory powers and responsibilities. Devon ICS comprises three key components:

- **integrated care board (ICBs)**: statutory body responsible for planning and funding most NHS services in the area
- **integrated care partnership (ICPs)**: statutory committee bringing together a broad set of system partners (including local government, the voluntary, community and social enterprise sector (VCSE), NHS organisations and others) to develop a health and care strategy for the area (see below)
- **Local Care Partnerships** - place-based partnerships between the NHS, local councils, VCSE organisations, residents in communities, service users and carers will be key to the success of the One Devon ICS. There are 5 in Devon. One Northern Devon and the Northern Local Care Partnership are currently merging.

Due to illness LWIB have been unable to share a full report, please see the following brief update as an overview of CD work:

- Slowly building momentum with our youth work, taken a long time to get off the ground (similar to other OC's) and have found some doors hard to open
- Postcard project starting in new year. Social Prescriber to refer 10 patients to receive fortnightly postcards
- Charity Calendar produced by local resident - LWIB supported though sales
- Links being made with local Care Home to create some local community events including garden, quiz events, a couple of groups to have use of lounge areas. Details to follow in new year.
- Looking at ways to develop the Wellbeing Walks as have been successful- depending on staff/volunteer availability looking at doing 2 levels of walks.
- First Community Soup event (fundraiser) went well - winner had donation, local councillor has also given all 3 a donation to support work. Winner also had 2 kits sponsored by Rotary and in thanks will volunteer at their fair. 2nd fundraiser booked for Fri 15th March
- Joint work currently going on with Age Concern and a joint event to be held on Tues 20th Feb -10-12.30
- Community Garden work ongoing
